Amelia Earhart

The courageous exploits and spirited personality of aviator Amelia Earhart made her an international celebrity. Her dazzling achievements include being the first woman to cross the Atlantic Ocean in an airplane (1928), and the first woman to pilot herself across the Atlantic by plane (1932).
