A Hands-On Outreach Opportunity for All Ages

**Monday, February 17 (President's Day)
from 12 - 2 p.m. at the Aurora Facility**

Join FCC for a volunteer opportunity to visit **Feed My Starving Children** in Aurora, where we will help in their unique mission of packing food that brings children back from the brink of starvation around the world. FMSC was founded in 1987 by food scientists in Minnesota from such large corporations as Cargill, Pillsbury and General Mills who had the vision of applying their knowledge to help those whose malnourished bodies could not be restored by shipments of conventional food.

It works. But it has to be mixed, packed and sent to places of need, and that's where our work on February 17 comes in. FMSC has created several packing centers like ours in Aurora, comprised of small tables designed to mix and cleanly bag the four parts of the end product, called Manna Pack. Parents, children (age 5 and up), and retirees can all do this work together in a fast, fun environment. We were fortunate to reserve 30 places at the Aurora site to do this on President's Day, when many of our children are out of school. It's a unique chance for families to do some good while having a great time!

BLACK HISTORY MONTH COURSE

Excerpts from *The 1619 Project* Sundays in February @ 11 am / Family Room

Led by Adult Education Committee

Our Black History month course curriculum will rely heavily on the August 18, 2019 issue of the *New York Times Magazine* called *The 1619 Project*.

The living artists, writers and scholars who contributed to this magazine issue and broader project will receive the primary focus and place of honor as our course teachers. We will take time during each Sunday morning class to appreciate, in general, their broader life work, but also the courage and care they offered in wrestling with a particular topic or event of US Black history to make their individual contribution to the Project.

The course will be designed to provide introductory engagement with representative portions of this project each Sunday morning in February, with longer reading/study/response assignments for course enrollees to work on through the week for an hour or two as they opt in. This Project includes a 100-page issue with 35 contributing artists, writers, and scholars. It has 17 literary pieces, 11 essays, and 6 brief historical inserts. There's also a podcast titled *1619*, with episodes that connect to several of the essays.



Dear Church: A Love Letter from a Black Preacher to the Whitest Denomination in the US

The black preacher and author is Lenny Duncan. The whitest denomination is the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). Duncan is now an ELCA pastor. But his often reckless youth and young adulthood would have predicted him ending up otherwise. One reviewer of *Dear Church* writes: "Duncan brings the truth about being black in the whitest church in the USA, about being queer in a queerphobic context, about

the stigma brought against formerly incarcerated folk. Lenny reminds the church of our call from God to be church not just for the margins, or to the margins, but recentering ourselves in the margins." If you're up for a challenging read that generates compelling conversation, this may very well be the study you're looking for.






