ABUNDANCE GRATITUDE HOSPITALITY

I believe that somewhere in each of us there is a measure of **ABUNDANCE** God provides for us to share with others. I believe that somewhere in each of us there is a measure of **GRATITUDE** for **ABUNDANCE** through which God generates a ready willingness of heart for us to be generous. I believe that somewhere in each of us there is a measure of **HOSPITALITY** through which God equips us to put our GRATITUDE for ABUNDANCE into action for the sake of God's loving will being done on earth as it is in heaven.

Our experiences may vary—but the ABUNDANCE, GRATITUDE, and **HOSPITALITY** are there.

This year, I long for a different kind of participation in our annual Stewardship Campaign. This year, I don't want to hear about what we cannot do. Each and every one of us can do—and can do more whether we pledge \$1.00 a week or \$10.00 a week or \$100.00 a week or \$1,000.00 a week.

This year, I want to hear about what we can do—and will do—to act generously together. Because when we act generously—personally and as a congregation—we make ministries happen here at FCC.

And by "make ministries happen" I mean not only sustaining current ministries. I also mean expanding those ministries and, even more, making entirely new ministries happen.

For several years now, FCC has been doing what amounts to bare bones ministry because of underfunding. That being said, FCC still does amazing things that focus on Christ being central, on diversity being cherished, on being inspired by the risen Christ to Seek—Connect— Serve.

But there is so much more that we could do—and can do—by increasing our giving.

Underfunding limits possibilities for growing our ministries. Underfunding discourages and even prevents thinking big and outside the box about our ministries. Underfunding frequently handcuffs our staff as well as our boards and committees when it comes to generating and then having the resources to carry out new ideas for our ministries. Underfunding sells FCC's ministries short.

Increasing our giving will expand our current ministries and make new ones happen. Increasing our giving can and will generate a generosity that, in the words of St. Paul, "not only supplies the needs of the saints but also overflows with many thanksgivings to God." Such generosity also supplies the needs of those beyond our community of

Whatever measure of **ABUNDANCE**. **GRATITUDE**, and **HOSPITALITY**

we experience in our lives, it is incumbent on every one of us to join together to act generously. Otherwise, we are limiting our capacity to make ministries happen, ministries through which we lovingly serve God, gladly uphold one another, and compassionately reach out beyond our congregation, near and far.

It is time to overcome minimalist "cannot-do" giving by embracing abundant "can-do" giving. Because as Walter Brueggemann reminds us, when it comes to being recipients of God's grace: "Together we have enough... and more than enough to share."

Our Stewardship Campaign runs through Commitment Sunday, **November 4,** when we encourage all to dedicate their pledges by placing them in the offering plate during worship. 


Songs of Love from the Stage and Screen



Four Gospels, One Jesus

Sundays in November at 11 a.m. in the Family Room *Led by Phil & Rebecca Courington*

Many people ask, "Do we really need four gospels in the Bible? Shouldn't one do the trick?" Maybe that would work if Jesus had been just a regular person who just did regular things. But he wasn't and he didn't! We have four gospels because during the early church period, four people found it necessary to tell the story of Jesus from four different perspectives. Each of the gospels was written for a different audience, by a different author, who was trying to accomplish a different purpose.

As we read through the gospels during this 4-week class, look for new insights and details you may have missed in before. Try viewing the events and lessons from a new or different perspective. As you read, ask yourself these questions:

- What does Jesus say about himself?
- Who is Jesus talking to? (disciples? enemies? a crowd?)
- What does Jesus say about God?
- How does Jesus react to different situations? What pleases him? What upsets him?
- What does Jesus tell people to do?

To prepare for classes, please read the following Gospels: Mark (for 11/4), Matthew (for 11/11), Luke (for 11/18), John (for 11/25).


On October 7, Youth helped World Communion Sunday worship, including serving communion to the congregation and leading time with children.



Looking Ahead: Pastor Fred's Mini Sabatical

Part of my terms of call as your pastor include taking a sabbatical after my first five years of service at FCC. Over the past couple of years, for a variety of reasons, I haven't been able to take my full 8 to 10-week sabbatical. Recently, I have been working with staff and church leaders to put together a mini sabbatical for 2019 as an alternative, and I'm excited to share with you that I will be taking this mini sabbatical from Thursday, December 27 through Saturday, January 26.

I have been very involved in lining up several guest preachers, which will be announced in the near future. In addition, I have already met with Laurel Hamilton (our Temporary Assistant to the Pastor for Pastoral Care) and our volunteers from the Diaconate Board and Stephen Ministers to help with pastoral care needs during my absence. We have made every effort to lighten the financial impact of my absence by working closely with the Finance Committee chair.

We will be sharing more details over the next few weeks, but know that I am leaving you in good hands, and am looking forward to this opportunity for rest and renewal.



Your Foundation Dollars at Work

With guidance from the Reserve Study conducted last year, the Properties Committee has completed several more projects with the financial backing of the Foundation. The projects completed so far this year were all identified as part of the recommended regular maintenance schedule.

The Community House

We continued the work on updating the Community House, with a total roof replacement in March, complete floor refinishing in April, and shrub and tree trimming around the parking lot in June. We also replaced the microwave and vacuum.


Efficiency Improvements

In April, all of the light bulbs in the Sanctuary and Narthex were updated to LED, for more uniformity and cost savings over time. We also had the aging control system for the heating and air conditioning updated, for more precise programming that can be done right from the office area, instead of from the air handler room!

Trimwork

Finally, we will be painting all the church doors and wood trim next May. Although we had hoped to have this completed this fall, the bidding took longer than expected and we couldn't get on the schedule for this year.
