

Take Time to Be Holy

It's not just a good idea:

Nobody on his deathbed ever said, "I wish I had spent more time at the office." ~Paul Tsongas

The trouble with the rat race is that even if you win, you're still a rat. ~Jane Wagner

It's the Law:

Remember the sabbath day, and keep it holy. For six days you shall labor and do all your work. But the seventh day is a sabbath day to the LORD your God; you shall not do any work—you, your son or your daughter, your male or female slave, your livestock, or the alien resident in your towns. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but rested the seventh day; therefore the LORD blessed the sabbath day and consecrated it. ~God

It takes a life time to fully comprehend what it means to "remember the sabbath day, and keep it holy." Perhaps a good starting place for taking time to be holy is to go by the numbers:

- One day is one-seventh (14.3%) of the week.
- One-seventh (14.3%) of one day is 3 hours and 26 minutes

This summer, challenge yourself to set aside just 3 hours and 26 minutes a week—that's only a sabbath of a sabbath—to make more room for God and the power of the Holy Spirit to work in/on/with you. It does not have to be 3 hours and 26 minutes all at once. You can spread the time over the week. You can apportion it whatever way helps you actually accomplish it.

But however you arrange your 3 hours and 26 minutes, commit yourself to taking this time to be holy, to do things that feed your soul. Read scripture. Pray. Breathe deeply. Enjoy the company of family and friends. Rest. Exercise. Go to a game. Take in the arts. Volunteer. Check out websites for devotionals, such as www. d365.org and www.pray-as-you-go.org.

Do any of these. Do some in combination. Switch the combinations. Do all of them. Contact me if you need further suggestions (seriously: fclyon2@gmail. com or 798-2800).

Dare to live this summer in a way that best gets you out of your office and rat race routines long enough to discover and deepen your God routines.


